The Lectures

Wednesday 18 March 2009 Images and Interpretations of Alexander the Great

Especially designed for HSC Ancient History students, this fully illustrated lecture looks at the bewildering images and interpretations of the Macedonian monarch who led his armies in conquest across half the known world. There is the Alexander of written sources: contemporary authors, of later antiquity, of medieval literature, of modern scholarship. Then there is the Alexander of the archaeological record, the Alexander of art, and the Alexander of folklore. Finally there is the Alexander of the Hellenes, of the Egyptians, of the Persians and of the Indians. Ultimately, the question that presents itself is "Who was Alexander?" Come along and draw your own conclusions.

Extracts from a number of films and documentaries will be screened on the tactics employed by Alexander the Great during his campaign to conquer the Persian Empire, and the legacy of his military achievements.
