norance, Paul's numerous appearances include The Killing Game, Inheritance, Term of his Natural Life and Verdict. Paul is also a founding member of the Bulldog Theatre company and appeared in the premier production The Negotiating Table and is one of the original returning cast members of Alex and Eve and really should get out more.

As a writer, Alex's first screenplay Sydney's Underworld has re-

> ceived three stages of development funding and is scheduled to be shot next year. His second screenplay won the best nonproduced screenplay in 2004. In December of 2008, the film version of Alex's hit stage show Alex &

Eve was one of two projects chosen out of 300 by Australia's national film body, Screen Australia, and given development funding to assist in the making of the film in 2010. Alex's fourth screenplay, Golf Hackers, has recently received development funding from the Australian Film Commission and has been bought by a prominent production company in America.

Alex has had three of his stage plays

performed: The Negotiating Table, Better Man and Alex & Eve. Alex & Eve: The Wedding is

Alex's fourth stage play. Did you expect A & E The Wedding to be so successful?

No. When writing the play, I was extremely conscious that sequels usually do not work. So I worked extremely hard on the script. Even though it was a sequel, I felt it was important to make the play stand on its own, with its own set of themes and journeys for the characters. Then when we got into rehearsals, the chemistry of the cast started to click, with the awesome direction of Michael Block, and we were starting to feel good about the production as it was coming together. they really relate to them which is really satisfying to hear.

Yes. The Alex & Eve courtship has resonated with the community. I am really looking forward to exploring the next chapter in Alex & Eve's lives – parenthood. It is a major transition for all married couples, in particular Alex & Eve so I am looking forward to sitting down and exploring this next phase in their lives

How do yo feel on stage?

I feel most comfortable on stage. Like being at home. I love the relationship that occurs every night in the theatre between the storyteller and the audience. This is why we do theatre. To tell good stories.

Writing or acting? What fufils you most?

I enjoy both enormously. Although, it is overwhelming as a writer to begin with a blank piece of paper and to end up with a living breathing show that audiences connect to.

What has been/your best worst moment on stage?

Best: Performing at Enmore Theatre a few weeks ago in front of a full house of 1700 people. It was a tidal wave of energy hitting you on stage. Amazing. Unforgetable.

Worst: once I almost threw up while on stage performing.

Robert has appeared in the three previous seasons of Alex and Eve and is reprising his role as Bassam for The Wedding.

Robert, what do you think of Alex & Eve The Wedding.

I enjoy it a lot. It has so much energy and excitement. I have appeared in the three previous seasons and I truly believe more will follow...

So, that means that if there is another Alex & Eve production you would like to continue your role as

> Bassam. Absolutely.

Where were you born? I am a real multicultural one... I was born in England. My father is

Russian, my mother Hungarian. *Are you married?* Yes. I have four kids.

How many years have you been into acting?
