

Gone in an instant

DIMITRIS Soulas is not one of those photographers who grew up with a camera in his hands. With a background in finance, he was employed by a Munich multinational in the mid-1960s until he co-founded, along with other Greeks abroad, the Panhellenic Anti-Junta Union.

He convinced his company to dismiss him due to his political activities and took to the streets as an independent photo reporter.

As a photographer for the Associated Press news agency and prestigious magazines Stern, Quick and Neue Revue between 1967 and 1974, he captured common people in their daily errands, mainly in Germany, but also Thessaloniki.

Soulas' subjects include migrants, outcasts and student protestors, as well as more famous faces such as those of author Gunter Grass, mime artist Marcel Marceau (top left) and Chancellor Willy Brandt.

With the fall of the Greek junta in 1974, Soulas, now 71, returned to Greece and the business world. In 2004, he donated his photographic archive to Munich's Photography Museum. These days he works in documentaries.
