My personal big dream:


I don't like to look too far into the future. God willing, i'd love to own a hairdressing salon. The way I want it

Designers triumph

EASTERN Suburbs designers Kiri Pappas of Coogee, Bianca Linton of South Coogee and Ainsley Hansen of Randwick have won four awards between them at the 2009 Flair Fashion Awards.

Kiri, Bianca and Ainsley are all students of the TAFE NSW Sydney Institute Fashion Design Studio. Studio head Nicholas Huxley said these three up-and-coming designers were up against 500 entries from across Australia, in categories ranging from cocktail, through to tai-

loring, swimwear, creativity, bridal, theatre and Generation Y.

Students from the Fashion Design Studio won 17 out of 30 awards this year, with total prize money of around \$17,000" Mr Huxley said.

"This is another fantastic year for our emerging designers who are taking Sydney design talent to new and exciting levels every year.

"It is dynamic new designers like Kiri, Bianca and Ainsley, who are putting Australia on the map in the future of the fashion industry".

The annual Flair Fashion Awards involves a panel of high-profile judges from the fashion industry assessing the entries before the Premiere Evening.

The designer of the year is chosen from winners of each category and wins prizes valued at \$5000.

Micaela Ezra is a Sydney Institute Fashion Design Studio graduate and a previous winner of the Flair awards.

He said: "As a designer who gets caught up in the energy of creating something beautiful, we are so fortunate to have an event which allows us to present our personal expressions and explorations to the world".
