We haven't published it yet but, All Saints has also won an international commendation in the prestigious and difficultly judged Emerging Architecture Awards in London. All Saints is also shortlisted for the National Architecture Awards in Australia.


I'd like to recognize Sozomenos family and all the, sub-contractors and their work crews who worked with us to provide the fine facility that you'll be touring shortly.
