Describing it as the “best experience of my life”, Anastasia is daring to dream of one day making it big in Hollywood and has even hired an agent to find her future acting gigs.

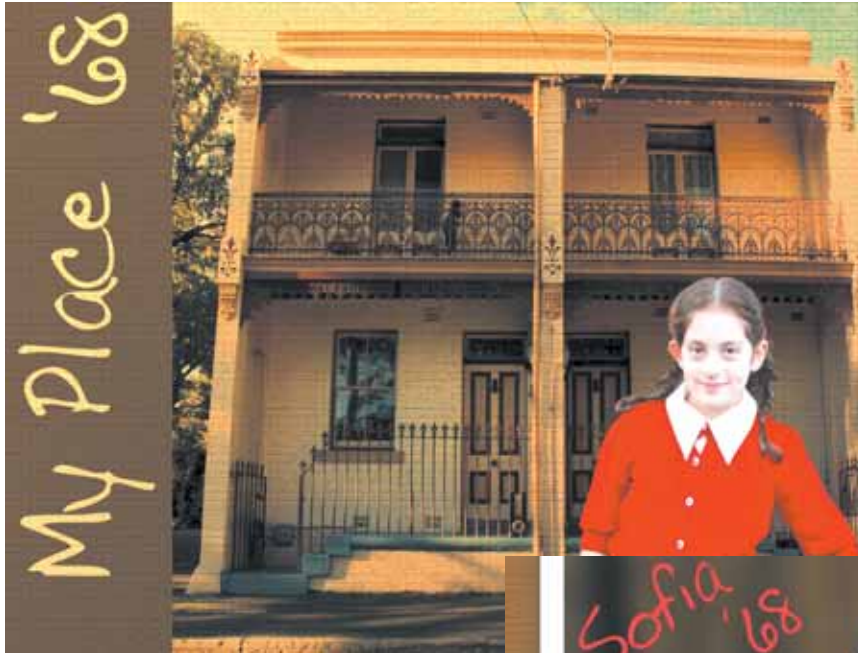
“It was a fantastic experience. I don’t normally like early starts but I was more than happy to wake up early for this series”, Anastasia said.
