⇒ BIG MONEY PAID TO AGENTS IN THE UK!

Just how much have Premier League clubs in the UK relied on agents? It has been revealed for the first time, that the cost to the clubs is around a staggering £70 million was paid to middlemen in one year.

That is almost equivalent to the transfer value of one Cristiano Ronaldo, three Didier Drogbas- or the club record turnover of Everton in the last financial year.

Between October 1st 2008 and September 30th 2009, not so sururpisingly, Manchester City spent the most on agents- a staggering £12,874,283- one fifth of the total, but hardly a shock given the spending spree that followed since their takeover by Sheikh Mansour.

Their signings included Carlos Twez, (£47 million), Emmanuel Adebayor (£25 million) and Joleon Lescott (£22 million).

Manchester City were followed by their predecessors as the cash-rich kings Chelsea, with an outlay of £9,562,223, and Liverpool, who despite their financial problems, spent £6,657,305.

Of greater surprise is that Manchester United spent a relatively modest £1,517,393. Burnley, the Barclays Premier League new boys, are bottom of the table with agents' fees of £468,398.

Some doubt was cast on the accuracy of the figures last night when Hull City claimed that the amount paid by them was £1,820,250, about £220,000 more than the total given.

The figures include all fees paid to agents with regard to player purchases, sales and contract negotiations, covering 803 transactions over a 12-month period. Although averaging less than £100,000 per transaction, many of the fees were considerably higher, which will inevitably lead to criticism of the huge sums of money leaving the game.

The publication of agents' earnings will be broadly welcomed by fans concerned that large sums are being wasted. It follows a change in FA rules in 2007, which was fully supported by the Premier League clubs.

"We are pleased that through these new requirements, clubs are bringing greater transparency to the domestic transfer market," an FA spokesman said. "For the first time there will be a game-wide picture of the level of spending on agents."

The Football League has published agents' fees for the past five years, when they have declined considerably.

In the last set of figures, published in August, the total was £8.8 million, a £2.3 million reduction from the previous season. Lord Mawhinney, the Football League chairman, believes that the move towards greater transparency in the Premier League will have a similar effect.

Melbourne and Sydney will continue their rivalry in the Hyundai A-League - to add even more fuel to the fire that burns deep between the Victory and Sky Blue fans is that this match will also mark the 500th national league appearance for Melbourne Victory captain Kevin Muscat.

On Sunday, Newcastle Jets host North Queensland Fury at EnergyAustralia Stadium before we head north to the Gold Coast where the boys from the glitter strip meet the lads from the west coast, Perth Glory. After dropping out of 5th spot for the first time in seven weeks Perth will be looking to assert their finals aspirations against Gold Coast and get within a point of the home side. Gold Coast will be tough to beat at home having won their past two matches at Skilled Park and with the addition of former Brisbane Roar playmaker Charlie Miller will be tough opponents for Burns and his Glory boys.

Gold Coast United (3) v Perth Glory (6):

Perth Glory coach David Mitchell is set to coach his 50th Hyundai A-League match - Mitchell commenced his head coaching career at the Perth Glory in November 2007.

SOLUTION SWORLD CUP EXPANDS TO 24

FIFA has decided to expand the women's World Cup from 16 to 24 teams in 2015.

Although the 2011 tournament in Germany will stay at 16 teams, FIFA secretary general Jerome Valcke said that women's soccer had advanced so much it made sense to add teams.

SAME FORMAT FOR U/23's

FIFA has further turned down calls to restrict the Olympic men's soccer tournament to players 21 and under.

It will stick with an under-23 format plus three over-age players for the 2012 London Games.

European governing body UEFA wanted the change to ensure that top players stay with their clubs during preseason training. But FIFA's executive committee decided to retain the existing format for the next Olympics.
