His strike rate in front of goal then landed him a deal with topflight Greek club AO Kerkyra for two seasons before going to Cyprus

Olympiakos Nicosia.

"The whole thing was just an awesome experience," Foti said.

"But I'm back now and the goal is to get as high up as I can in Australia. There's a lot more opportunity now (with the A-League) so hopefully I can have a good season with Manly and see what happens."

United coach Phil Moss is excited to have Foti in his squad after first coaching him in the Spirit youth team almost 10 years ago.

"He's always had the talent but he's obviously a lot more cultured player since then," the United boss said.

Athens. Greeks are among the most dissatisfied citizens in EU both by the economic condition of the country and the development of the European economy. This is what was noted in the results announced Tuesday by Eurobarometer, Greek ERT television

92% of the Greeks are dissatisfied by the economic condition of Greece (about 75% in Europe) and 78%-by the development of the European economy (about 62% in Europe). Eurobarometer reseach reads further 94% of the people in the inquiry are dissatisfied by the condition of the labor market in the coun-
