

Ticks stop for Town Hall clock

The historic clock on Sydney Town Hall has stopped chiming for up to eight weeks while the clock's 1880s winding gears are repaired.

A recent City of Sydney inspection found urgent safety repairs were required to allow the clock to continue to function.

The iconic clock will continue to keep time throughout the duration of the repairs.

Lord Mayor Clover Moore MP said the repairs will ensure the clock will continue to chime for years to come.

"Sydney Town Hall is the civic heart of our city and is an iconic heritage building," Ms Moore said.

"Workers, residents and visitors are all used to hearing Town Hall's hourly chimes and this work will ensure the clock can continue to chime for decades to come."

The Sydney Town Hall clock was made by British clockmakers Gillett, Bland & Co and dates to the 1880s. The clock's chimes can be heard throughout the Sydney CBD every hour and quarter hour.

The repairs to the Sydney Town Hall clock are part of an ongoing five year upgrade of the building.

Stage one of the project was completed in February this year, with the building officially reopening to the public in March after a \$40 million essential services, internal safety and fire services upgrade.
