Black Anniversary of Turkish Invasion of Cyprus in 1974

Prime-minister G. Papandreou and all Greek political parties issued messages to mark the 36th black anniversary of Turkish invasion of Cyprus in 1974. Till August 14-15 Turkish troops had occupied 40% of Cyprus including Ammohostos and Morfos after the collapse of the Geneva Conference. Special importance was placed on George Papandreou meeting with Cyprus President Dimitris Hristofias on Wednesday at Larnaca Airport, where the Greek Prime-minister stayed few hours prior to his departure for Israel and Palestine.



Prime-minister's Message

In his message Prime-minister G. Papandreou says:

"36 years have passed since Turkish invasion of Cyprus. It is a painful anniversary for Cyprus, Greece and Hellenism. July, 20, 1974 signaled the beginning of illegal occupation of big part of Cyprus by Turkish troops- illegal occupation of an independent country, member of the UN and the EU. International world order was violated on that day and violation continues to present.

Present situation of Cyprus is unacceptable and must end through the achievement of a just, viable and functional solution on the basis of UN Security Council resolutions- a bicomunal, bizonal federation.

We actively support Cyprus President D. Hristofias efforts. Cyprus issue is of top national priority for Greece. We call on Turkey to indicate the necessary political willingness for a just

settlement of the Cyprus issue. A necessary precondition for complete normalization of Greek-Turkish relations. The Cypriot people-Greek-Cypriots and Turkish Cypriots have the right to live in an environment of peace, security, prosperity and confidence.enjoy the benefits of the EU and contribute to the common European vision".

In his statements Cyprus President Dimitris Hristofias said:

"We indeed have to deal with a difficult interlocutor, who many times behaves as violent actions can be accepted and at the same time for communication reasons, heralds that he wants a solution within 2010. History has taught that we should all assume our share of responsibility within the framework of efforts for a solution of the Cyprus issue which will reunite our country, people, economy and institutions, put an end to occupation and settlement and restore human rights for all Cypriot people".

Investigations into S. Goliass murder continue

The Antiterrorist Agency is carrying out investigation into the murder of journalist Socratis Goliass after test results indicated that Revolutionary Sect is behind the heinous crime. The journalists' archive, which is in the hands of the antiterrorist agency, is expected to give valuable information. Socratis Goliass funeral was held at Hlioupolis Cemetery on Tuesday afternoon.



The antiterrorist agency is examining Revolutionary Sect proclamations in order to decode names of people threatened as the organization showed in a tough way that it executes what it writes. They are also waiting for a new proclamation, which according to their strategy will be sent to a newspaper in the next days.

All political parties and journalists' unions as well as the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe have condemned the heinous crime.

Swimming ban at dirty beaches

The Health Ministry imposed a ban on swimming on polluted beaches, declaring several stretches in and around Attica as out of bounds and forbidding bathers from stretches of coastline close to ports, shipyards and industrial sites.

According to the decision signed by Minister Mariliza Xenogiannakopoulou, swimming will henceforth be banned at all ports and marinas. Specific areas declared off-limits to bathers include the entire stretch of coast between Piraeus and Perama, between Skaramanga and Aspropyrgos and off the coast of Megara.

Swimming will also be banned within 50 meters of pipes channeling sewage and drainage water into the sea.

Although bathing in dirty water might be an obvious turnoff for many, experts note that a large number of Greeks continue to swim in dirty water, choosing beaches that are close by or the easiest to get to and showing little con-

cern for the quality of the water. "Swimmers often choose beaches on the basis of habit or what is most convenient," according to Maria-Adamantia Efstratiou, honorary professor of marine sciences at the University of the Aegean.

Young people or those with a strong constitution will likely not be adversely affected by immersing themselves in less than crystal-clear waters, most experts say. But many warn of the problems that can afflict the less physically robust. Efstratiou cited gastroenteritis, skin rashes and ear infections as some of the more common ailments reported by some who swim in polluted water.

Experts recommend that concerned citizens check out the website of the Environment Ministry for details of the beaches that have earned blue flags, a stamp of approval awarded as part of a European Union initiative.
