# The Mountain in Front

Racism, religious belief and provincial pride come under close scrutiny in the Mountain in Front, a social drama with a very clear message.

When a van full of pyrotechnists breaks down in a mountain village on Easter weekend, old feuds ignite between local farmers. For Albanian shepherd Luan, a vna full of fireworks means some long-awaited fun for his seven-year old son. But for the local farmer Thymios, the idea of a Muslim setting off rockets on a Christian holy day brings old grudges to the fore with tragic results.

Weird science, 30 million dollars in missing mob money and a couple of hit men on a mission create a riotous comedy farce from filmmaker Stratos-Markidis.

When New Yorker Mike Kanias stops for some cigarettes and loses a truckload of mafia money he knows it's only a matter of time before the mob comes looking for him. But Mike isn't your average guy – he's the world's first human clone, created in the 70s by a group of pioneering scientists. Now to escape his pursuers he's travelling to the small Greek village of Karditsa to trade places with Grigoris Kanias, the man they cloned him from, but lazy womaniser Grigoris is in some trouble of his own.

Both cleverly funny and over the top, I Love Karditsa features hilarious performances from Costas Apostolakis and Katerina Papoutsaki.


