## A fairer system for taxi passengers and drivers

Minister for Roads David Borger said the NSW Government will conduct a study to identify more areas in Sydney where taxis can safely and legally pick up and drop off passengers.

Mr Borger said the study will aim to increase the number of places that people can get into a taxi and reduce the instances of taxis getting fined.

"This study will aim to deliver a fairer system for taxi drivers and better access to taxis for passengers," Mr Borger said. Under the NSW Road Rules, taxis are prohibited from stopping in no stopping, no standing and bus zones as well as T-ways, with penalties of up to \$201.

Based on feedback from Sydney taxi drivers, ten key Local Government Areas will be targeted to participate in the trial:

- City of Sydney
- North SydneyWoollahra
- Parramatta
- Hills Shire

- Blacktown
- RydeRandwick
- Willoughby
- Liverpool

In 2007 a trial of 'No Stopping Taxis Excepted One Minute Limit' zones took place at six Sydney CBD sites, where safety was not compromised.

The trial was deemed a success and these zones are now able to be installed at other locations across NSW, with the approval of the local council's traffic committee. Through the study announced today, the NSW Government will work with the Taxi industry and councils to roll these out and investigate other stopping zones.

"What we are doing here is working to deliver fairer, more flexible rules for taxis and taxi passengers," Mr Borger said.

"The taxi industry told us they need more areas to legally and safely pick-up and set-down passengers and this review is about identifying those areas.

"We will also explore the possibility of taxis using the Liverpool to Parramatta and North West Tways - to see if they could be used without impacting on bus services.

"This study could potentially save both taxis drivers and their passengers time and money."

The study is expected to start next month and will take around six months to complete. The RTA will work with local councils and Transport NSW to finalise a report based on the study's findings.
