POLICE REPORT

Barricaded man surrenders to police

Police spent more than seven hours negotiating with a man who had barricaded himself inside his home yesterday.

About 3pm police were called to a home in Mitchell Street in Moree after concerns were expressed for the welfare of a man at the premises. Police attended the address and found that a 29-year-old man had armed and barricaded himself inside the home.

Police established a perimeter around the premises, and specialist police were called in to assist.

About 11.30pm he gave himself up to police and was taken to Moree Police Station.

No persons were injured during the incident. The local man was subsequently charged with Armed with intent to commit indictable offence and Assault police officer in execution of duty without actual bodily harm. He has been refused bail to appear before Moree Local Court this morning.

Women charged after robbery

Two women will face court after a store attendant was locked in a storeroom during a robbery at an inner west clothing store yesterday (Tuesday 12 April).

About 11.40am, a female attendant at a King Street clothing store in Newtown walked into a storeroom when the door was pulled shut from the outside.

Police were told one woman allegedly held the door shut while another took money from the cash register, before both ran from the store.

Officers arrived a short time later and established a crime scene.

Following inquiries by Newtown Local Area Command's Proactive Crime Team, police attended a home at Illawarra Road, Allawah, and arrested two women.

A search warrant was conducted with police seizing a number of items.

Two women, aged 23 and 28, have been charged with larceny and take/detain person in company with intent to obtain advantage (kidnap).

They were refused bail to face Kogarah Local Court later today.

Suspicious house fire

Police are appealing for public assistance after a suspicious house fire in the Hunter region last night (Tuesday 12 April).

About 6.20pm, numerous neighbours and motorists contacted Triple Zero to report a house alight at Edgeworth Street, Cessnock

Emergency services arrived to find the single-storey fibro home well alight. It took 25 minutes to extinguish. There was no-one home at the time of the blaze.

Initial investigations suggest that entry to the home had been forced and the fire had been deliberately lit. Further forensic examination will take place today.

Police now want to hear from anyone who noticed suspicious activity in the area last night or has information about the incident.

Woman arrested after elderly targeted

Police investigating the robbery of a 64-year-old man in the Lake Illawarra last month and the attempted robbery of a 70-year-old woman on the weekend have made an arrest.

On 23 March, a 64-year-old man was walking near the intersection of George Street and Shellharbour Road, Warilla, when a woman allegedly pushed him in the chest. The man fell to the ground and the woman allegedly took his wallet.

On Sunday morning (10 April), a 70-year-old woman was walking on Hall Lane, Warilla, when a younger woman allegedly grabbed her handbag and pushed her to the ground. The younger woman then took a wallet from the handbag and ran from the scene but was chased by a 45-year-old man who managed to retrieve the wallet and return it to the older woman.

During both incidents, the victims suffered cuts and bruises.

Detectives have also been investigating the theft of grocery items from a Warrawong supermarket on 9 April.

Following extensive inquiries, police attended a home in George Street, Warilla, last night where they arrested a 37-year-old woman. She was taken to Lake Illawarra Police Station and charged with robbery, larceny and breach of bail offences.

She was refused bail to face Wollongong Local Court later today.

Exercise "Capricorn"

More than 200 police, emergency services and Sydney Airport personnel have taken part in yesterday's Exercise Capricorn, a Local Emergency Management Committee exercise designed to test a multi agency response to an off airport aircraft accident.

Exercise 'Capricorn' is being conducted to test a multi-agency response to an off airport aircraft crash at Tempe. The exercise scenario involved the testing of a local level multi-agency response, site control and hazmat response to a plane crash. A number of volunteers have moulaged and played the role of crash victims.

This exercise involved the NSW Police Force, NSW Fire and Rescue, Ambulance Service of NSW, NSW Health, Australian Transport Safety Bureau, the Australian Federal Police, Sydney Airports Corporation Limited, Marrickville Council, Rex Regional Express Airlines and Airservices Australia, and was conducted at Tempe, bordering the Sydney Airport.

The Minister for Police & Description of the Minister for Police & Description of the Emergency Services, the Hon. Michael Gallacher MLC said the exercise is a valuable opportunity to test the response of a range of agencies to an emergency we all hope never happens. "Our emergency management arrangements are robust and have been well tested over the years whether it be floods, bushfires or aviation accidents."

"However we must be prepared, and the public must have confidence in our ability, planning and preparation for this sort of an emergency" the Minister said.

Deputy Commissioner David Owens, the State Emergency Operations Controller, said that the exercise has been months in planning.
