Police Commissioner welcomes lowest crime rates in 20 years

Police Commissioner, Andrew Scipione, has welcomed the latest Bureau of Crime Statistics figures that indicate major categories of crime are at their lowest rate for 20 years.

Comparing 10 main crime categories from 1990 to 2010, BOCSAR has found the murder rate has halved while robbery with a firearm has fallen 66 per cent.

In other trends,

✓ Motor vehicle theft is down 70 per cent
✓ Break and enters (non-dwelling) is down 62 per cent

✓ Break and enters (dwelling) is down 43 per cent

✓ Robbery with a weapon (not firearm) is down 23 per cent

✓ Robbery without a weapon is down by five per cent

Commissioner Scipione said it was very pleasing to see such dramatic reductions, particularly in relation to violent crime.

"It is great to see police making such great inroads in relation to serious crime," Mr Scipione said, "These figures indicate our crime strategies are working, but there is always a need to stay one step ahead of the criminal element." The Commissioner identified sexual assaults as one of the crime categories police will continue to target. "This is a terrible crime, most often perpetrated behind closed doors in homes by people known to the victims. "I think we are noticing a change with more victims willing to come forward and we need to reassure people that they will be safer reporting such crimes to police." The Commissioner also pointed out that a firm police approach to alcohol-related crime appears to be reaping dividends. "There has been a 14 per cent reduction in assaults in New South Wales in the past two years. "I believe stringent alcohol-licensing conditions are having a positive effect," the Commissioner said, "The number of assaults in licensed premises fell by 11 per cent in the 12 months to July 2010.

"There was a 27 per cent reduction in 'glassings' in licensed premises during the same period." "In the last 24 months, assaults reported in clubs, restaurants and nightclubs are also down, by almost 17 per cent. "This suggests the police message about personal responsibility is starting to get through," Mr Scipione added. He warned the police crackdowns on alcohol-related crime and anti-social behaviour will continue. "We will be staging Operation Unite again next month, targeting alcohol-related violence across the entire state." The Bureau of Crime Statistics and Research has also released more figures indicating that in the 24 months to December 2010, all major categories of crime in New South Wales are either stable or falling.

They include:

✓ Robbery with a weapon not a firearm: down 11 per cent

✓ Robbery without a weapon: down 6.9 per cent

✓ Break and enter (non-dwelling): down 11.4 per cent

✓ Steal from person: down 10.6 per cent

✓ Malicious damage to property: down 10.1 per cent

✓ Motor vehicle theft: down 9.3 per cent

✓ Steal from motor vehicle: down 4.8 per cent

"What is most pleasing is that the two weapons offences of 'unlawfully discharge firearm' and 'discharge firearm into premises' are both stable," Mr Scipione said, "However one incident of gun crime is one too many and we won't stop working to rid the streets of illegal firearms.

"Police are also targeting theft from retail stores, service station drive-offs and break and enter offences. "The rise in stealing offences in some areas of the state might indicate tougher economic times but that does not give anyone the right to resort to theft. "Police are taking the initiative in relation to these crimes, working in conjunction with retailers through crime prevention strategies, business forums and the formation of the Organised Retail Theft Targeting Committee.

"The State Crime Command's Property Crime and Fraud Squads are leading the fight against theft, along with Region Enforcement Squads and Local Area Commands through their dedicated Anti-Theft Units and Target Action Groups," the Commissioner said.

Police investigate arson attack on tattoo parlour

Police are conducting inquiries after a tattoo parlour was set alight at Chippendale, in Sydney, this morning. About 3:05am, police believe a number of offenders broke into the Wellington Street complex and entered the parlour using a sledgehammer. It is alleged an accelerant was thrown into areas of the parlour which were set alight. Internal sprinklers in the building were activated and extinguished the separate fires. The offenders fled the scene with one male seen running from the building. He is described as wearing a yellow hooded jumper. Police from Redfern Local Area Command and Fire and Rescue NSW personnel attended a short time later. A crime scene was established and examined by forensics specialists. Redfern detectives are now appealing for public help as they attempt to identify and locate the offenders. Teenagers charged over alleged armed robbery of pizza delivery man

Three men will appear in court today charged over an alleged armed robbery of a pizza delivery man in Sydney's west last week. About 10:35pm on Wednesday 13 April, a 27-year-old pizza delivery man was allegedly threatened with a knife by two men while making a delivery to Burford Street, Merrylands. It is alleged the men held the knife to the 27-year-old's neck before demanding cash and his mobile phone. The men also took the pizza before fleeing the scene. Detectives attached to Holroyd Local Area Command have been investigating the incident. About 10am yesterday, police executed a search warrant at a house on Clarence Street, Merrylands, and arrested an 18-year-old man. He was taken to Merrylands Police Station where he was charged with robbery whilst armed with an offensive weapon. Two men later attended Merrylands Police Station and spoke with detectives.
