POLICE REPORT

Armed robbery - Maroubra

Police are seeking three males after the armed robbery of a fast food restaurant in Sydney's Eastern Beaches last night (Tuesday 26 April).

Just before 11pm, three males wearing dark clothing and armed with knives and a metal bar entered the restaurant on Anzac Parade, Maroubra, which had ceased trading for the night. Police were told the men threatened the 25-year-old owner of the restaurant before directing him into a cool room from where he could hear the sounds of items being smashed. Sometime later, the owner managed to escape into a nearby laneway. He was uninjured. When police arrived at the scene, they found an amount of cash had been taken and the front of the store had been extensively damaged.

They established a crime scene and are now appealing for anyone with information about the incident to come forward.

Armed robbery at fast food restaurant - Banksia

Police investigating the armed robbery of a fast food restaurant in southern Sydney are appealing for witnesses to come forward. Just before 10pm yesterday (Tuesday 26 April), two men entered the restaurant on the Princes Highway at Banksia and threatened two staff members with knives.

The men demanded money before escaping with a sum of cash into a champagne-coloured sedan which was parked on Albert Street. The car was last seen heading towards Banksia Avenue.

The two staff members were uninjured.

Police from St George Local Area Command arrived a short time later and established a crime scene. The Forensic Armed Robbery Unit was also in attendance.

Detectives would now like to speak to any person with information about the incident who has not yet spoken to police.

The two men were described as being of Mediterranean/Middle Eastern appearance, aged in their early to mid 20s and having muscular builds.

The first man was about 175cm tall and was wearing a black and white striped hooded top, dark-coloured tracksuit pants and white joggers. The second man was wearing an orange hooded top, grey tracksuit pants and white joggers.

Anyone who can identify the men or their car, or has information about the incident, should contact St George Police Station via Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

Suspicious fire damages new development - Yagoona

Police are appealing for public assistance after a suspicious fire damaged a new residential development in Sydney's southwest last night (Tuesday 26 April).

Emergency services were called to the fire at Dargan Street, Yagoona, about 11.15pm, where fire fighters extinguished the blaze. The development, comprising six blocks of units and town houses, was still in the final stages of construction and did not yet have any residents. Eleven sep-

arate residential properties in four of the blocks suffered fire damage.

Initial inquiries by police suggest the fire is suspicious and further forensic examination will be conducted. Investigators from Bankstown Local Area Command are now appealing for anyone with information about the incident to contact them via Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

Two charged with aggravated break and enter upon panel repair shop - Taren Point

Two men have been arrested after entry was allegedly forced to a southern Sydney panel repair shop and the business owner threatened yesterday afternoon (Tuesday 26 April). About midday, a man attended the shop in Taren Point regarding an alleged civil dispute with the business owner.

Police were told the man was ushered from the premises by a staff member after yelling at and pushing the owner, and allegedly threatening him with a tyre lever.

Some time later, he returned to the premises with another man.

It will be alleged two vehicles parked outside the premises were extensively damaged before entry was forced to the shop. The owner and a number of staff members were inside at the time, as were three young children.

Police were told the owner was allegedly threatened and had a car stand thrown at him, however, he was not hit. A car radiator was also damaged after a brick was thrown at it.

Police arrived on the scene a short time later and the two men were placed under arrest before being taken to Miranda Police Station. No one in the panel repair shop was injured. A 23-year-old Sans Souci man was charged with aggravated break and enter with intent, affray and two counts each of assault and malicious damage. A 49-year-old Narwee man was charged with aggravated break and enter with intent and affray. Both men have been refused bail and are expected to face Sutherland Local Court today.

Appeal for public assistance after three people assaulted - Tweed Heads

Tweed Heads Detectives are appealing for public assistance following an alleged serious assault on the state's far north coast last week. About 8pm on Friday 22 April, two groups were allegedly involved in a fight near a hotel in Wharf Street, Tweed Heads. As a result a 38-year-old man was allegedly struck on the back of the head, causing him to fall to the ground, where he was again struck in the back with the pole.

A 33-year-old man from Mt Helen in Queensland received a number of minor facial injuries during the incident.

A 33-year-old local woman was also allegedly punched during the incident.

The 38-year-old man was taken to the Tweed Hospital where he remains in a serious condition.
