Victorious Sydney Olympic coach Peter Tsekenis was pleased with the hard work put in by his players to secure the three points: "Ob viously they came home strong today in the second-half though we are very happy with the win. It wasn't our best performance though it was a match where we needed to pull up our sleeves up and fight to the end, and I am happy the boys did that well. "We played them (Blacktown City FC) a few weeks ago in the Cup and I was a little worned we would take them. lightly after the win there. We've had a busy schedule and haven't really needed to be desperate in our matches this season, so we needed the boys to be on their game today, and I thoughtwe did that. "They put a lot of pressure, and were unlucky not to equalise, though in saying that we had a couple of chances late on and a few penalty calls that didn't fall forus so we are glad to get the points at home. 'They are a great side, they are a topthree side and we are now nine-points ahead of them, so that shows where we are, even though we can certainly lift our performances," Bekenis commented. With a Waratah Cup match coming up on Wednesday, Bekenis confirmed any side he puts out onto the park is expected. to play for the win, notwithstanding which competition the side is playing in: "At the moment there are a few injuries in the side and also a Saturday match coming up so we will need to assess over the coming days. "Our priority is definitely the League, though with any player that I put out onto the park I expect to win, regardless of whether they are from our 18%, 20% or senior team. "We will be definitely going out on Wednesday evening looking for the win," Tsekenis concluded. Blacktown City FC coach Mark Crittenden was pleased with the efforts of his players despite the loss: "The boys really

gave a great account of themselves today, and to be honest I thought a draw would have been a fairer result. "We started sluggishly, and to concede the goal in the 3'-4' minute, that is disappointing. "In saying that, we totally dominated the second-half. We spoke at the break and this group of players is so close, so united, and the boys really put in a massive effort in the second-half. "In saying that, we need to put away our chances, and today we created a number of goal scoring opportunities in the second-half though we didn't take them, and that ultimately cost us in the end," ended Crittenden. In the Grade-2D division, Blacktown City FC defeated Sydney Olympic in a convincing 4-0 romp.
