Olympic closed the match on the front foot as Todd Bamber and Chris Triantis combined down the right in 90' minute as the Blues pressed for a second goal late on, though the latter's through ball to Mileski was well read by the Blacktown City defence. Victorious Sydney Olympic coach Peter Tsakiris was pleased with the hard work put in by his players to secure the three points: "Obviously they came home strong today in the second-half though we are very happy with the win. It wasn't our best performance though it was a match where we needed to pull up our sleeves up and fight to the end, and I am happy the boys did that well. "We played them (Blacktown City FC) a few weeks ago in the Cup and I was a little worried we would take them lightly after the win there. We've had a busy schedule and haven't really needed to be desperate in our matches this season, so we needed the boys to be on their game today, and I thought we did that. "They put a lot of pressure, and were unlucky not to equalise, though in saying

that we had a couple of chances late on and a few penalty calls that didn't fall for us so we are glad to get the points at home. "They are a great side, they are a top-three side and we are now nine-points ahead of them, so that shows where we are, even though we can certainly lift our performances," Tsakiris commented. With a Waratah Cup match coming up on Wednesday, Tsakiris confirmed any side he puts out onto the park is expected to play for the win, notwithstanding which competition the side is playing in. "At the moment there are a few injuries in the side and also a Saturday match coming up so we will need to assess over the coming days. "Our priority is definitely the League, though with any player that I put out onto the park I expect to win, regardless of whether they are from our 18's, 20's or senior team. "We will be definitely going out on Wednesday evening looking for the win," Tsakiris concluded. Blacktown City FC coach Mark Crittenden was pleased with the efforts of his players despite the loss: "The boys really

gave a great account of themselves today and to be honest I thought a draw would have been a fairer result. "We started sluggishly, and to concede the goal in the 3'4' minute, that is disappointing. "In saying that, we totally dominated the second-half. We spoke at the break and this group of players is so close, so united, and the boys really put in a massive effort in the second-half. "In saying that, we need to put away our chances, and today we created a number of goal scoring opportunities in the second-half though we didn't take them, and that ultimately cost us in the end," ended Crittenden. In the Grade-20 division, Blacktown City FC defeated Sydney Olympic in a convincing 4-0 romp.

NSW Super League Round 14 Review

West Sydney Berries retain the league leadership but lead by just the one point ahead of Spirit FC, who stay second despite their second loss in a week. Blacktown Spartans, winners over Spirit, moved to within three points of top, and still have two games to play, both at home, so the next month will be very interesting out Francis Park way. The adverse midweek weather restricted the schedule to only three games, so there is no movement at the bottom of the table, but both Fraser Park and Dulwich Hill will take to the field during the week.

Granville Rage v West Sydney Berries 1-1

A very, very late goal from Nenos Bobo snared a point for Granville Rage over the visiting West Sydney Berries at Garside Park. In almost the last kick of the match, Bobo, having his first game in almost ten weeks, got onto the end of a freekick, and poked away to deny the Berries the three points. The league leaders had taken a first half lead through John Bironis, and it looked like they would hold on to their advantage until Bobo's late strike. The dropped points mean that West Sydney Berries maintain top spot, but only by the one point. "I am very disappointed", stated Steve Karavatakis, "we would have been three points clear had we won and now it is

just the one. I can't believe that they scored so late, it seemed their only chance of the game". Granville's Mauricio Islas thought otherwise, though. "We had a few chances and I think if we had taken one of them early, we might have gone on with it. But it was a difficult game, the pitch was very heavy. I thought we had them under the pump towards the end, maybe the last twenty or so".
