AHC (NSW) Calendar 'a window into a forgotten past'

s part of the commemorations for the 70th anniversary of the 1940-41 Greek Campaign, the Australian Hellenic Council (NSW) has produced a commemorative desk calendar. Endorsed by the Returned and Services League (RSL NSW Sub-Branch), the Calendar celebrates the special bonds between the ANZACs and the pallikarria (brave young men) of Hellas in the dark days of World War Two.

The keynote addresses were delivered by Mr Brad Manera, Executive Director of the ANZAC Memorial, Sydney, and Lt.-Colonel Gary Vale (Commanding Officer, Defence Police Training Centre, Lamia Barracks, Holsworthy).

An experienced historian who has visited Greece a number of times, Mr Manera praised the AHC (NSW) Calendar as being a 'very good cause' that provides 'a window in a forgotten past'.

The 1940-41 Greek Campaign was 'a shared experience; stated Mr Manera 'and that is the reason we are here this evening, invited by an organisation whose title suggests that this is shared space'.

Lt.-Col Vale echoed the praise of the ANZAC Memorial's Executive Director. 'I see great leadership, and I see great people. I see people that are passionate and loyal, honourable and who have got a fire in their belly'.

The Commanding Officer of the Military Police Training College in Sydney expressed his own appreciation of the AHC (NSW) Calendar project as an educational tool.

In his address, AHC (NSW) Coordinator George Vellis, focussed on the campaign for 'The Greek Star', which the AHC is supporting. 'The Greek government has honoured the diggers with a separate campaign medal; the Australian government should do the same.'

Both the Master of Ceremonies John Petropoulos (AHC NSW Vice-President) and Yiannis Kallimanis (AHC NSW Treasurer) emphasised the role of the Calendar in cultivating philhellenism amongst the political leadership of Australia.

This special publication, which combines 22 images with text to illustrate the story of Australian service in Greece and Cyprus between 1940 and 1945, was launched at Alexander's Cafe, Kogarah on Friday 29 July.

'From HMAS Sydney on patrol in the Aegean in 1940 to the Commonwealth War Cemetery of Athens today', stated AHC (NSW) Media, Policy and Research Director, Dr Panayiotis Diamadis, 'the Calendar presents a range of images of the Australian experience in the struggle against Nazism'.
