

Premier Youth League Round 20 Review

Grade 13 ...Marconi Stallions began the day as the competition leaders on goal difference and they had produced a 5-1 victory from their last meeting with tenth placed Sydney Olympic. The Stallions established a lead on the table of two points when they registered a 5-3 victory and that has left Olympic at tenth.

APIA Leichhardt Tigers were in second spot at kick-off time and they had battled out a 1-1 draw when they faced third placed Bankstown City in the first round. History repeated when the Tigers and the Lions once again played out a draw, this one scoreless, and that has left both teams where they were on the ladder.

Sydney United came into this match in fourth position and they had been held to a 1-1 draw by seventh place Parramatta Eagles and United remained at fourth when they took all the points this week with a 1-0 scoreline while Parramatta have slipped back to eighth.

In Round 11 catch-up action Rockdale City Suns suffered a 5-0 loss to Parramatta Eagles.

Bonnyrigg White Eagles arrived at this game in fifth place and they had beaten eleventh placed Blacktown City by the odd goal in five in their first round encounter.
