he Blues didn't miss a beat in an entertaining encounter against the Reds as defenders Richard Luksic and Emmanuel Giannaros sealed the deal with well taken goals infront of a boisterous home crowd.

Luksic headed home Chris Triantis' corner prior to halftime before the captain diverted a David Gullo cross, shortly after the re-start, into the path of Giannaros who converted from close-range to double the Blues' lead.

Sydney Olympic administered proceedings perfectly as the defensive line limited Luka Glavas & Co. to seeing very little of the ball.

Elsid Barkhousir had a chance late on to grab a consolation for the Reds, though the striker failed to hold onto the ball following Ben Vidaic's forward lob.

Sydney Olympic will now

enjoy a weekend off from official duties to prepare the Monday long weekend Grand-Final, as Sydney United will need to bounce back quickly against a confident Blacktown City FC side that has eliminated both the Bonnyrigg White Eagles and Sutherland Sharks over the first fortnight of the finals series.

Reigning champions Blacktown City FC kept their hopes of reaching the 2011 Grand Final alive after recording a gripping 2-1 defeat of Sutherland Sharks at Seymour Shaw on Saturday evening.

The defeat for the Sharks sees Robbie Stanton's men sign off from playing duty for 2011, meanwhile Mark Crittenden's men will now face off with Sydney United for a shot at Sydney Olympic in the season decider.

Despite conceding a lot

of possession against the Sharks, it was unyielding captain Luke Roodenburg who sent Blacktown City FC in at the break a goal to the good. A neat counterattack saw Travis Major pick out Roodenburg from the rightflank, and the striker made no mistake in side-footing the ball past Nathan Denham. Following the break, Sutherland deservedly drew level via a Panni Nikas longrange effort that crept inside Symon Jaegar's post. The goal spurred the Sharks on, though Blacktown City kept their nerve and again showed their character in defending stoutly before hitting the Sharks on the break via Sean Rooney for the winner. The striker showed his skill and prowess to outwit his markers and convert in exceptional fashion to seal the win.
