Players have to retired;


- Coaches, referees, administrators or media representatives may be recognised for their overall sustained contribution
- to the game. Recipients of an Australian Football Award may also be considered;
- Nominees must be Australian citizens;
- \bullet All nominations must be for individuals; and
- Unsuccessful nominees may be re-nominated in subsequent years.

The 2011 Football Hall of Fame nominations are now open and will close 5.00pm AEDT on Friday 4 November 2011.

Record numbers set for Futsal State Championships

The 2011 Futsal State Championships are set for kick off on Saturday November 5th with as many as 1,500 players and an incredible 225 teams participating. The Futsal State Championships will run across the weekend, utilising two venues - Penrith Valley Region Sports Stadium at Cambridge Park (Juniors) and Hawkesbury Indoor Stadium at South Windsor (Seniors). Amongst the 225 teams competing which 86 are senior teams, there will also be 10 Athletes with Disabilities teams. Age groups will see junior teams ranging from 9 to 15 while seniors will be from 16 years to All-Age. Football NSW Futsal Manager Damian Briggs is anticipating the big weekend ahead. "It's fantastic for the sport to have such a big event occurring next weekend. "Participation will be at an alltime high we so record numbers at both Hawkesbury and Penrith venues." Dunaden continues Cup's French revolution

Dunaden has won the Melbourne Cup (3,200m) in perhaps the closest finish in the race's history. The French-trained Dunaden and English galloper Red Cadeaux settled in for a bitter war of attrition in the final 100 metres and only the bob of the heads gave Dunaden a margin on the line. Lucas Cranach finished just over a length away in third. The 100,000 people at Flemington and millions around the world held their collective breath for what seemed an eternity as the judges pored over the photo finish. An elated Christophe Lemaire could not contain his joy as he saw his number go

into the frame, winning France its second Cup in as many years. Lemaire, one of Europe's finest riders, was handed the ride on Dunaden only late on Monday after Craig Williams failed to win a stay of proceedings pending an appeal against a careless riding ban. A Melbourne Cup win would have made Williams the first jockey to claim the Caulfield Cup, Cox Plate and the Cup in the same year. Connections of Dunaden had held the ride open for him pending Monday's decision but also arranged for Lemaire to fly to Melbourne from Tokyo. Dunaden is trained by Mikel Delzangles, a protege of

master French horseman Alain De Royer Dupre who claimed Cup glory last year with Americain. In an identical path to Americain a year ago, Dunaden scored a dominant win in the Geelong Cup that rocketed him into Melbourne Cup calculations. Americain ran as favourite this year and settled towards the back of the field before producing a colossal run under 58kg to finish a breath out of third place. The first seven horses over the line were either trained overseas or imported by Australian stables looking to European staying blood as a path to Cup success. For the record, Modun finished last.
