## Thessaloniki Mayor Boutaris defends mosque move

A week after inviting a group of students from the Muslim School of Komotini, in northern Greece, to visit and pray in Thessaloniki's New (Yeni) Mosque – for the first time after 88 years – Mayor Yiannis Boutaris has hit back at criticism of the move.

Writing for Kathimerini on Sunday, Boutaris, who has often come under fire from Orthodox priests and conservative pundits, said the move will "promote the city by highlighting the full range of its historical and cultural legacy."

Thessaloniki, Greece's second largest city, retains several Ottoman and Jewish structures. "The students' visit... is a clear sign of respect and religious tolerance not just toward our Muslim citizens but also toward societies with majority Muslim populations," he added.

## Clean up or pay up!

As of Monday, pet owners who do not clean up after their animals face being fined by their local authority. A new law that seeks to penalize pet owners who do not take care of their furry friends will come into effect on Monday, introducing penalties of up to 30,000 euros. Owners who do not clean up the mess pets leave behind will face fines of 100 euros; if they do not provide their municipality

As of Monday, pet owners who do not lean up after their animals face being electronically registered, the fine will be a 300 euros.

If drivers hurt an animal in an accident and abandon the scene, they will also be fined 300 euros. The sale of an animal less than eight weeks old will carry a fine of 1,000 euros, while anyone found guilty of abusing their pet will face a financial penalty of up to 30,000 euros.



## Investigation finds fresh evidence ahead of trial
