Dancing Guardsman of King of Greece

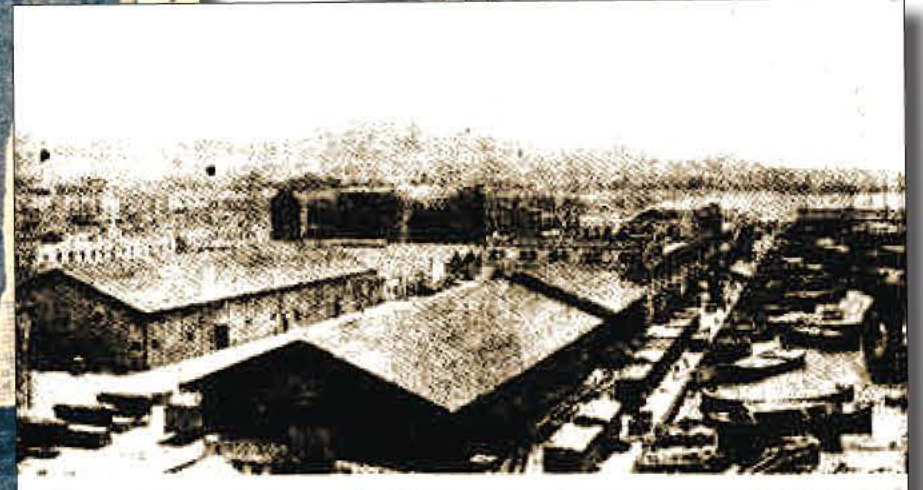
