Hypatia's death in Alexandria: The penalty for freedom

Greek Studies at UNSW Arts & Social Sciences and the Foundation of Hellenic Studies warmly invites you to a public event in memory of philosopher Hypatia who lived in Alexandria and died in 415 AD. Hypatia sacrificed her life at the altar of knowledge to become a symbol of freedom and integrity. The talk aims to address the following questions:

Who was Hypatla, a woman revered by the people of Alexandria, and highly respected by the Emperor of Constantinople?


Who despised her and called her "an impudent infidel and vile pagan woman" to the point of engineering her torture and death?

What is Hypatia's legacy for our modern inter-conflicting contemporary world?

Featuring: Hypatia's Death in Alexandria features a public talk by Mrs Ralli-Catharios on Hypatia's legacy. This public event is organised as a tribute to the Greek Neoplatonist philosopher, since 2015 is the year that we commemorate 1600 years from her death.

Hypatia's Death in Alexandria will be launched by Professor Eileen Baldry, Dean of UNSW Arts & Social Sciences. The keynote speech by Mrs Ralli-Catharios will be preceded by a choreographic performance, designed by Paroula and Nicole Thurban, and a poetry reading recited by Athanasia Costa.

Blography: Mrs Ralli-Catharios is well known for her contribution to the establishment and development of the Special Broadcasting Service in Australia. An advocate of Multiculturalism and Equality, Mrs Catharios contributed to the development of Greek-Australian Associations. Sophia Ralli-Catharios established a reputation as an author, essayist, poet, crafting a successful international career as a playwright, her last play being that of Hypatia.
