When dealing with shopkeepers, one of the most interesting aspects to their character is their wisdom. As they have dealt with hundreds and thousands of different customers over the years, these experiences naturally provide them with so many insights into human nature and life itself. On August 6, 2017, Vasilis Vasilas interviewed Pandelis Vlahakis who runs the Espress Grill at Darling Harbour (food court); being in such a busy food hub, Pandelis and his sons, Manolis and Giorgos, witness hundreds- if not thousands- of people dining in their food court, or just passing by.

aving completed his National Service, Pandelis came to Australia, in 1970, to visit his siblings. What was meant to be holiday turned out to be forty-seven years! His first job in Australia was at the Carba factory, in Botany, which bottled carbon dioxide and he then moved on to a construction company, Dilligham, which was building the QANTAS building at the time.

Pandelis married Evangelia and they have four children: Manolis, Ekaterina, Giorgos and Emilia.

Pandelis always wanted to open up his own business; an opportunity arose to buy a fish and chips shop on Darling Street, Balmain. At the time, Balmain was a rough area and Pandelis has wonderful stories of how different the Australian way of life is.

For some time, he would run a sandwich shop on Elizabeth Street and his landlady- the owner of the building- was actually Queen Elizabeth II; Pandelis states he never had any problems with his royal landlady! From there, he went on to run the Red Lion Restaurant in Redfern; he has a great story of becoming a 'brother' to the local indigenous community as he was one of the first sponsors of their local radio station! As a journeyman, he ran shops in Marrickville, then Padstow and Newtown. In 1999, an opportunity came up to buy the Bistro and Grill Harbourside in Darling Harbour's food court. Having a shop in Darling Harbour during the Sydney Olympics (2000) was, as Pandelis says, 'incredible'. Pandelis has run the Espress Grill ever since; his sons, Manolis and Giorgos, are now an important part of the business.
