NPL NSW Men's competition leaders Sydney Olympic underlined their Premiership credentials with a commanding 2-0 victory over 10-man Sydney United 58 at Sydney United Sports Centre on Saturday evening

Sydney United 58 - Sydney Olympic 0-2



Abbas Saad's side entered the encounter riding the crest of an eight-match unbeaten run and extended their advantage at the top of the table after cruising to another three points in what was a heated clash with their fellow competition heavyweights at Edensor Park.

The damage was done in a sensational opening half cameo from the Blues who opened the scoring through Spanish star Alejandro Sanchez before Thomas Whiteside's volley gave the visitors breathing space on the cusp of half time. Peter Markovic's dismissal early in the second half for an altercation with Sanchez ignited a savagely fought second half between the two former NSL rivals, and although the home side matched Olympic in the battle the visitors proved too streetwise and trotted to their ninth win of the season. The result ensures the Blues will finish the first half of the regular season in pole position while opening up a 12-point gap over United 58 on the table.

United 58 had won four of the previous six encounters with Olympic but the coach-less outfit were unable to match the speed and intensity of the league leaders and will lament their poor opening half showing in which the likes of Sanchez, Max Burgess and Jinya An controlled proceedings for the visitors.

Sanchez, who had already flashed a warning shot across goal in the match's fledgling moments, made no mistake with his next opportunity in the 19th minute, dinking the ball past Thomas Manos for his eighth goal of the campaign after Radovan Pavicevic had robbed Yianni Fragogiannis on the edge of the box and slipped the forward through on goal.

The Spaniard's effort established a foothold for the league leaders who drew several good stops from Manos before doubling their advantage shortly before half time through Whiteside, who fired home a superb left-footed volley at the back post after a poor headed clearance from Adrian Vlastelica.

It was Whiteside's second goal in successive weeks as the defender stole the headlines in round 10 for scoring a memorable 'scorpion goal' that awarded the Ultra Football Goal of the Week.

The uphill battle facing the Reds prior to the second half was complicated further five minutes into the second stanza when defender Markovic received his marching orders following a dispute with Sanchez. It was an uncharacteristic response from the defender as the match seemed to slip after the experienced campaigners dismal.

Markovic's send-off provoked the Reds' best spell of the match but despite the aggression and intensity on show from the hosts, Olympic showed excellent control to weather the storm and grind out a hugely valuable away victory.

In a tactical switch Patrick Antelmi was sacrificed for Jordan Roberts to keep the score-line down as United 58 battled hard in the second stanza which to their credit held their own keeping the Blues at bay.

Panni Nikas made his return to the NPL NSW Men's competition after missing three weeks and he tried to spark a Reds revival but the Blues defended in numbers as they rolled on to a deserved victory.

Having overseen his side's latest masterclass, Olympic





coach Abbas Saad was glowing following the match and eagerly highlighted the caliber of football the competition leaders are currently playing.

"I thought we were absolutely superb," said the Blues coach.

"In the first half we played them off the park and it should've been all over in the first 45, we had enough chances to win two games.

"The boys are so confident – I've told them that if you want to be a good footballer, you have to go out there and express yourself. You can't play football with handcuffs, you have to let them play in a system and that system suits them well.

"There's a great togetherness in the team."
