Season is in the books and it is Sydney Olympic who are in control in top spot at the half way mark of the competition.



A rifled finish from Sam McIllhatton that sent Sydney FC into the break up 1-0 before Jeremy Cox confirmed the points with an arrowed finish in the second stanza to help his side fight their way off the bottom of the ladder. Rockdale City Suns coach Paul Reid offered no excuses for his sides poor performance, despite playing three games in a short time-frame, they weren't at the races tonight and were dominated by a youthful Sky Blues side.
