

Football Federation Australia Notice of Annual General Meeting



Football Federation Australia (FFA) has today issued the Notice of the Fifteenth Annual General Meeting (AGM), which will be held at 2:15pm on Monday, 19 November, 2018. The purpose of the AGM is to receive and consider the Annual Financial Report of FFA, report on the Annual activities of FFA, inform the members of the FFA annual budget and elect up to four directors to the FFA Board. The members will consider, and if thought fit, pass resolutions to grant qualifying member status to Football Coaches Australia (FCA) and the Association of Australian Football Clubs (AAFC) under the FFA constitution. Further the members

will consider, and if thought fit, pass a special resolution to amend the FFA constitution in relation to the qualifying member status of AAFC to give effect to a recommendation of the Congress Review Working Group. In relation to the election of Directors at the FFA AGM, the FFA Nominations Committee, consisting of Joseph Healy, Simon Pearce, Stuart Kenny and John Didulica met today (Saturday 27 October) to review the nominations received by FFA for the positions of FFA Director. McCormack scores against former club, Vidosic is super sub as Mariners and City draw

A late goal from substitute Dario Vidosic has seen Melbourne City snatch a 1-1 draw with Central Coast Mariners at Gosford on Saturday. **The Mariners** looked on course for victory after former City striker Ross McCormack scored against his old club midway through the first half. **But Vidosic** found the equaliser six minutes from time after a mad scramble in the box to ensure the spoils were shared. **City boss** Warren Joyce was worried in the build-up that McCormack would come back to bite his former club and it proved to be the case on 21 minutes. **A poor** defensive header from City's Iacopo La Rocca fell to Connor Pain just outside the box, with the young winger taking the smart

option to feed McCormack rather than shoot himself, with the Scotsman doing the rest. **City then** dominated possession for the rest of the contest, especially after the break as the home side looked to hold on for a 1-0 win. **But the** Mariners' resistance was finally broken on 84 minutes by super-sub Vidosic. After the Mariners failed to adequately clear a corner, the ball was pin-balling around the box before falling to Vidosic who fired home from close range despite the best efforts of keeper Ben Kennedy. **City almost** won it in stoppage-time when Bruno Fornaroli blazed over the bar from inside the box but it finished all square to keep both teams unbeaten after two games.
