## Sydney FC – Wellington Phoenix

### 1. Top Opta Facts

- Sydney FC are undefeated in their last six games against Wellington Phoenix (W5, D1); their last loss against the New Zealand franchise came in March 2016 (3-1 at Allianz Stadium).
- This will be just the second A-League game played at Jubilee Stadium; however, Sydney FC have won their last three games on the bounce against Wellington Phoenix when hosting, scoring two first-half goals in each of those games.
- Sydney FC have lost two of their last three games played at home, and will be looking to avoid back-to-back defeats at home for the first time since March-April 2016.
- Wellington Phoenix have picked up just one competition point from their last eight games away from home (D1, L7), restricting their opposition to fewer than two goals on just two occasions in that period.
- Sydney FC are one of just two teams (Melbourne City) yet to concede a goal within the first 15 minutes of either half this season.
- Wellington Phoenix have a shot conversion rate (inc. blocks) of just 2.5% in the second half of games this season, lower than that of any other team, while Sydney FC (21%) are ranked highest in this category.
- Sydney FC's Adam Le Fondre has a shot conversion rate (inc. blocks) of 32% this campaign, the best of any player to have attempted at least 10 total shots (inc. blocks).
- Sarpreet Singh (Wellington) has made 12 total shots (inc. blocks) this season, the most of any player who is yet to score a goal.
