Round 6 NPL NSW Men's Review

Wollongong Wolves hold onto top spot on the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition for the sixth straight week after a massive Round six wrapped up on Sunday.

The Wolves needed a late goal from the competition's top marksman Thomas Jane to ensure they snatched a point from a visiting Mt Druitt side and cling onto first place.

APIA Leichhardt missed a chance to leapfrog Wollongong after they were held to a scoreless draw by Hakoah Sydney City East.

Marconi Stallions claimed the biggest win of the week with a 5-0 drubbing of Sydney United 58 in what was a result nobody would have expected going into the weekend's action. **Rockdale returned** to the winners circle after the sacking of Paul Reid last week with victory against reigning premiers Sydney Olympic.

Finally Blacktown City jumped into the top three with a narrow win against Sydney FC.
