National Premier Leagues NSW Men's 1 Round 19 wrap

Round 19 of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition is in the bag and Wollongong Wolves are only a game shy of potentially clinching the title.

Luke Wilkshire's Wolves had a big win on Saturday to move only two points shy of securing a historic Premiership win for the club.

While the Premiership race is almost done and dusted, the battle for the remaining finals positions is still very much up for grabs with this week's results adding a new twist to the tale.

Marconi Stallions late run of form has them back in the top five with only three games to go, while Sydney United 58's form slump has them outside the finals places for the first time since the opening weeks of the season.

With only handful of points separating third from ninth anything could happen in the run home.

Wollongong Wolves 4 - Sutherland Sharks O at WIN Stadium

Wollongong Wolves are on the precipice of claiming the 2019 National Premier League NSW Men's Premiership after a 4-0 win over Sutherland Sharks at WIN Stadium on Saturday evening.

Two goals in each half was enough to secure the result for the Wolves, who move within one point of claiming the Premiership with only three rounds remaining.

Despite both sides seeing solid opportunities go begging in the opening exchanges, it was the hosts who finally broke the deadlock in the 30th minute thanks to a goal from in-form striker Lachlan Scott. Darcy Madden scored ten minutes from the break to give the hosts a 2-0 lead.

Scott turned provider early in the second half to set up Takeru Okada while Golden Boot leader Thomas James wrapped up the win with a 69th minute screamer.

Marconi Stallions 4 - Mt Druitt Town Rangers 2 at Marconi Stadium

Marconi Stallions have kept their finals hopes alive with a 4-2 win against Mt Druitt Town Rangers at Marconi Stadium on Saturday.
