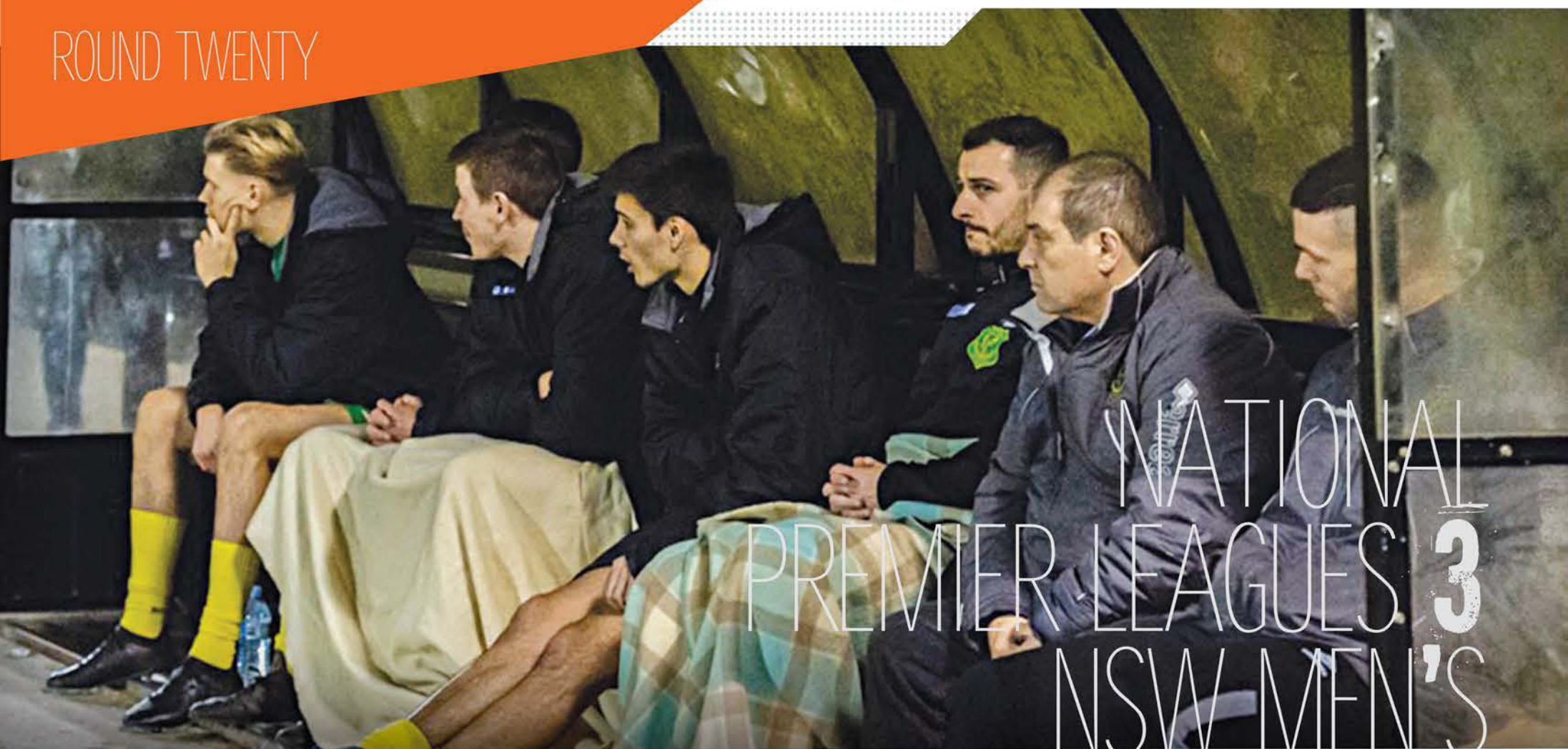


ROUND TWENTY

NSW MEN'S

The 2019 National Premier Leagues 3 NSW competition has a knack of continually producing a flood of excitement, and the Round Twenty fixtures over the weekend were no different.

The Western NSW Mariners and Granville Rage played out a 1-1 stalemate in Mudgee; Stanmore Hawks left it late to snare all three points in a 2-0 win over Dulwich Hill on a day devoted to the McGrath Foundation; SD Raiders bounced back from their midweek reverse against Bankstown City to overcome Parramatta FC 4-2 at Ernie Smith Reserve; Bankstown United and ten-man Inter Lions played out an entertaining 1-1 draw at Jensen Park; Camden Tigers overpowered Hawkesbury City 4-0 at the Ron Dine Stadium on Saturday night; whilst Sydney University grabbed a welcome three points in a hard fought 1-0 victory over Dunbar Rovers.

Dulwich Hill – Stanmore Hawks 0-2

The McGrath Foundation took centre stage at Arlington Oval on Saturday, and huge congratulations to Dulwich Hill and everyone who played a part in supporting and raising funds



for a fantastic charity.

The day culminated in an eagerly contested first grade football match, where Stanmore Hawks left it late to snare all three points in a 2-0 victory over Dulwich Hill.

It was an arm wrestle from the outset, and the two Arlington Oval tenants looked set to share the points as the match meandered towards full time.

But Stanmore's veteran, Sam Awad, popped up in the 87th minute to head home from close range following a corner, sending the Stanmore contingent into raptures. Conor Quiligan expertly converted a cut back three minutes in to injury time to clinch the points, giving the Hawks a 2-0 victory on the night.

The loss sees Dulwich Hill fall back in to 9th spot, and they are now 11 points from a Finals position. On the other hand, the win and three points moves Stanmore Hawks to 47 points, and a healthy 5 point lead at the summit of the competition as their march towards a Premiership continues to build momentum.

Football NSW today unveiled a new logo and brand, to promote the whole of football in NSW.

The overarching brand strategy and design was developed in conjunction with FFA's brand agency, Hulsbosch Design. **The process** involved consultation with more than 4,000 stakeholders across the game nationally.

Football NSW Chief Executive Officer Stuart Hodge said the new logo signifies unification alongside the rest of the Member Federations as well as the Football Federation of Australia (FFA).

July at the ever-popular State Cup Finals hosted at Valentine Sports Park.
