secure them a shot at a top five finish.

Rockdale City Suns have the chance to spoil the premiership party of Wollongong Wolves when the two sides come head to head at Ilinden Sports Centre on Sunday. **The Suns** need to take all three points from the match if they are to keep their finals hopes alive and will look to their last match against the Wolves where they were shock 2-0 winners as inspiration.

A 2-0 win against Manly in Round 20 was Rockdale's only win from their past five matches with the side struggling at the back end of the campaign.

Despite this they are still in with a chance of a top five finish but it will require two wins from their final two games.

Coach Abbas Saad has made some risky selection decisions in recent weeks with a number of his experienced players unavailable.

Last season's standout defender Tom Whiteside was a shock omission from last week's team and his demotion to the Under-20 side, despite the absence of Will Angel and Mitchell Stamatellis, had Olympic fans asking plenty of questions.

They take on a Sydney United 58 side which finally broke through their recent struggles in a 3-0 win against bottom side Hakoah Sydney City East.
