And just like that we have reached the end of the regular season in the 2019 National Premier Leagues 3 NSW Men's competition. The past six months have provided us with all the passion and excitement that we have come to expect as we look back on the last full set

The final league standings are locked in, with Stanmore Hawks this season's Premiers whilst SD Raiders, Bankstown City, Gladesville Ryde Magic, Bankstown United and Inter Lions are the five sides alongside front runners Stanmore who will be fighting it out for the Championship.

Dulwich Hill and Hawkesbury City played out a 2-2 draw at Arlington Oval; SD Raiders were 3-1 winners away to Gladesville Ryde Magic; Dunbar Rovers triumphed 4-1 at home to Bankstown City; Bankstown United and Stanmore Hawks shared the points in a 2-2 draw at Jensen Park; Camden Tigers registered a 3-0 win against Parramatta at Melita Stadium; Inter Lions booked their spot in the finals, courtesy of a 3-1 win against Western NSW Mariners in Orange.

Sydney University Football Ground was this week's venue for match of the round, with Sydney University taking on Granville Rage on Sunday afternoon.

Gladesville Ryde Magic – SD Raiders FC 1-3

SD Raiders triumphed 3-1 away to Gladesville Ryde Magic at Christie Park on Sunday afternoon.

The all-important victory for Raiders means that they leapfrog Bankstown City into 2nd on the league table and earn the all-important rest period when the finals commence next week.

Edward Yoong scored in the first half for Magic however Raiders' goal scorers were not forthcoming as we went to press.

Magic finish the season in 4th position on the ladder, they will now face Bankstown United in one of the two elimination finals scheduled for next weekend.

Bankstown United FC – Stanmore Hawks FC 2-2

Bankstown United and Stanmore Hawks could not be split in their affair at Jensen Park with 2-2 the full-time score.

United were first to get on the scoresheet in this fixture, with Dalibor Malesevic on hand to give his side the lead.

A quick-fire double from Hawks' Peter Yannopoulos and Jonah Caragher after the restart gave the Premiers the lead as they approached the final half hour of the tie.

Lachlan Willmore later cancelled out Stanmore's lead, his goal ensured that they took a share of the points whilst it importantly tied up 5th spot ahead of the finals.

Stanmore finish at the top of the table in the regular season with 60 points, they now have the week off as they prepare for their preliminary final in a fortnight's time.

JOEYS U-17 AND U-15 SQUADS IN CAMP

Joeys head coach Trevor Morgan has assembled the two age groups at the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS) in Canberra The U-17 squad is in camp and the U-15 squad, giving players from both valuable preparation time and offering a unique opportunity for them to engage with each other and share their experiences, learnings and expectations.

Morgan said "We want to improve the standard of Australian football and give members of both squads a clear sense of where they sit in the development pathway. This includes inviting four players who represented Australia at the recent 2019 AFF U-15 Championship in Thailand into the U-17 camp, to share their experiences and in turn learn from the older age group.

"**The Under-17s** have built an exceptional team culture and we are very keen for this to be passed on to the next group coming through. The players realise their responsibility not only to their peers, but to the younger players in the national teams setup," he added.

Morgan also paid tribute to the Young Socceroos, who were victorious in the AFF Championship overnight, defeating Malaysia 1-0 to clinch the title.

He said "Congratulations to Gary van Egmond and the team, it's great to celebrate success at all levels of Australian football."

"**Gary will** be flying straight from Vietnam to Canberra to be part of this Joeys camp, and I'm sure he will be keeping a keen eye on players with the potential to step up into the Young Socceroos."

The U-17 squad is busy preparing for the FIFA U-17 World Cup Brazil 2019TM which runs from 26 October to 17 November, and next week they head to Leicester in England for another training camp and warm-up matches against England, Korea Republic and Brazil.
